The use of oral glycopyrronium in palliative care

There is limited information on the use of oral glycopyrronium in palliative care. Despite the poor oral bioavailability of oral glycopyrronium, it has been used in the management of drooling in palliative care. No information has been found to support the administration of oral glycopyrronium to treat excessive respiratory secretions at the end of life. The use of Scopoderm® transdermal patches in palliative care



Scopoderm® patches are licensed in the UK for the prevention of symptoms of motion sickness such as nausea, vomiting and vertigo. In palliative care, they have been used to control opioid-induced nausea, and in the management of drooling and sialorrhoea in patients with disorders of the head and neck. Hyoscine has also been used transdermally in adults for reducing respiratory secretions in combination with parenteral doses of glycopyrronium bromide. What are the treatment options for a chronic cough?

A cough is a physiological protective mechanism but may also be as a result of an underlying medical condition. A chronic cough is defined as lasting more than 8 weeks. Potential causes of chronic cough should be identified and corrected prior to proceeding with pharmacological treatment. When pharmacological therapy is deemed necessary antitussives may be of benefit. These include demulcents, opioids or opioid derivatives and GABA agonists.
