Three types of gifts you can leave

Firstly, we would advise you to get guidance from your solicitor to guarantee peace of mind and ensure your wishes are carried out.

There are three simple types of gifts you can leave in your Will

- 1. A fixed sum of money.
- 2. A specific item of value such as a piece of jewellery, shares or property.
- 3. A percentage of the value of your estate, after you've provided for loved ones.

If you already have a Will

Remember, you can easily change your Will to include a gift to Our Lady's Hospice & Care Services. Your solicitor will guide you through the process.

It makes tax sense

Legacies to charities are tax-free so it can help reduce tax payable on your estate.

My Dad was diagnosed with lung cancer when he was 84 years old. The hospice people who came out to our house were like angels. It lifted such a weight. So that's why I'm leaving a gift in my Will to the hospice – a percentage of my estate. As a Hospice Volunteer, I've seen how much they need the money and how wisely it is spent. I worked with Revenue so I know that it's tax efficient as well. Any amount is so helpful – a small, medium or large sum, a property, a valuable item. It's a really lovely feeling knowing I'll still be helping after I pass."

On the St Vincent de Paul visits to family homes you have the privilege of meeting all kinds of wonderful people who are facing all kinds of difficulties. You meet elderly people living the last stage of their lives, lonely and isolated. No one should face end-of-life alone.



The hospice is the exact opposite of that. It
